MINUTES OF MEETING

The Minutes of Meeting dated 12th October 2005 and the Minutes of the Planning Meeting dated 1st November 2005 were agreed and signed as a true record.

The Chair welcomed residents who were present to discuss public transport in the Parish. The Vice Chair had attended the meeting at Lower Penn and gave his report. Comments were taken from the floor and it was generally felt that a bus was needed to travel to Wolverhampton and Claverley on one or two days per week. It was suggested the Ruralink service travel to Merryhill and down Bhylls Lane, instead of travelling along Radford Lane, enabling passengers to link with the Wolverhampton buses. It was agreed that a questionnaire would be circulated to residents. Councillor Robert Reade, Chairman of Lower Penn Parish Council visited and stated the Parishes need to join up to suggest acceptable alternatives to justify the needs of passengers. Councillor Reade asked for a copy of the draft questionnaire to be sent to their Clerk in order that Lower Penn can canvas its residents with the same questions.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS

05/01121/FUL Coach House, Seisdon Hall, alterations and extns to provide No1 dwelling house – No objection

05/00858/FUL 1 Fox Close, extn. and conservatory - Objections on inappropriate development, adversely affect street scene. Extn. to west side is unsympathetic to surrounding area. Insufficient detail to comment on parking to the front but Councillors would object to the front garden being concreted over as this would be detrimental to the street scene. It appears from the plans that vehicular access to the garage would be impossible and the proposed development would be prejudicial to highway safety.

ANY NEW BUSINESS

Mr. Compson to take down noticeboard in bus shelter on Seisdon Road, Trysull.

Mr. Unwin was concerned about visibility at the Smestow Gate junction. Clerk to request a site inspection by the highway authority when it is dark.

The Vice Chair reported that large tractor tyres are in the driveway of Tarmac on Trysull Holloway. Clerk to speak to Mr. Stevens.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS (Continued...)

Councillor McCardle reported he has been notified by the SSC that the result of a question asked by Sir Patrick Cormack in the House of Commons, the Minister for Transport responded that the Western Orbital Route scheme was dropped from the Road Programme in 1996 and that remains the current position and there are no plans to reinstate the scheme. It was reported that a hawthorn sapling tree has died on the Green, Trysull, and the grass appears to have the chafer grub. Clerk to inform Landscaping at the SSC.

The Chair suggested a Standing Order be drafted for delegation of power when dealing with mid-monthly matters. It was agreed the draft will be discussed at the next meeting.

The Clerk reported her conversation with a resident of Fox Close and was asked to write thanking him for his concern.

Mr. Tonkinson has received quotes from A.M.S. Ltd for the annual maintenance of the School car park, Pavilion car park and Village Hall car park, and felt that the Parish Council should cover the costs. This was agreed and the Clerk was asked to write to the Village Hall Committee and Playing Field Association.

Tarmac are looking into the possibility of assisting with the levelling of the playing field.

Cricket Club

Mr. Tonkinson reported that the Cricket Club have been asked if they would put up an advertising sign on the perimeter of the playing field by Morgan Lees. Mr. Smith stated he would object to a number of boards around the field and it was agreed this one board would be allowed for one season and the Clerk was asked to inform Mr. Harper.

The Clerk was asked to write to the PFA and the VH Committee stating that any advertising must be approved by the Parish Council. It was felt that flyers and posters in the Village Hall should not be allowed and should not be attached to the walls by drawing pins, damaging the plaster.
